
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Current Tract Project



I am asking you to fervently pray for the safe passage of these tracts to their destinations, for the safe distribution of them, and for many souls to be saved as a result!












These are the tracts that are printed and will be sent. Lord willing, we will send 100,000 to Peru in a shipping container for Bro. Don Rich in the new year. There are 400,000 planned to go to Honduras and Guatemala when the printer is able to print the Bibles to go with the tracts. The remaining 100,000 may get to Venezuela. There is a possibility that some of the materials in Colombia may be able to be imported by Venezuelans into their home country. We are thankful to be able to have an impact on that beautiful country in spite of the many problems they are experiencing right now!

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Roman Catholicism Vs. Fundamental Christianity

(Praying for the Dead)

Editor's note: In preparation for writing this article, I came across an article on Foxnews.com on why Roman Catholics pray for the dead. I read it and wanted to post the article to help our reader understand what is meant by "Praying for the Dead". The article that follows is titled, "All Souls Day: Here's why priests advise praying for the dead". I will then show what the Bible says.

November 2 each year marks All Souls Day in the Catholic Church, dedicated to remembering those who have died.

It comes one day after All Saints Day, which commemorates all saints, known and unknown.

The practice of Christian prayer for their dead dates back to at least the second century, according to the Vatican's website, although the customs have changed over time.

Initially, one would specifically pray for the dead three days after the person's burial, then on the anniversary of that individual's death.

"Remembering the dead on [November 2] became official in the year 998 when Abbot Odilo of Cluny (994-1048) made it obligatory in all the monasteries subject to him," said the Vatican website.

All Souls Day is the "one day every year when Catholics everywhere remember their past," Fr. Thomas Petri, president of the Dominican House of Studies in Washington, D.C., told Fox News Digital.

"They remember the faithful who have preceded them," he continued — "their loved ones who have gone before them. And, in an act of filial love and piety, we pray for the deceased with the hope they will rest eternally with God in glory."

"In the early 20th century, Pope Benedict XV granted permission allowing all priests to celebrate three Masses on All Souls Day," said the Vatican website.

Typically, priests celebrate one Mass a day, the site notes.

"The liturgy proposes various Masses on this day, all of which are geared toward highlighting the Paschal Mystery, Jesus' victory over sin and death," the same source indicates.

Unlike All Saints Day, which is observed annually on Nov. 1, All Souls Day is not considered to be a holy day of obligation, in which Catholics are required to attend Mass, noted Catholic.org.

Still, the holiday is important to many Catholics.

Fr. Edward Looney, a priest in the diocese of <u>Green Bay, Wisconsin</u>, echoed the comments of Fr. Petri.

"All Souls Day is a day when we pray for the dead. Our prayers and sacrifices aid souls in purgatory in the process of purification," he said.

When a person dies, their soul either goes to heaven, hell or purgatory, according to website Catholic Online. "Roman Catholicism Vs. Fundamental Christianity", continued on page 5

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"The intermediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser (venial) sin, must go," the site notes.

Catholics believe that praying for the dead who are in purgatory helps them become spiritually prepared to enter heaven, the same source says.

"Purgatory is necessary so that souls can be cleansed and perfected before

they enter into heaven. There is scriptural basis for this belief. The primary reference is in 2 Maccabees, 12:26 and 12:32," according to Catholic Online.

Looney noted that "saints and mystics have seen purgatory," and that "we should not stop praying for our dead."

"Even if it's been years, because our prayers add to their accidental glory — according to St. Thomas Aquinas — which means they can better intercede for us," he added. To properly commemorate All Souls Day, Looney advised that people "have Masses said. Pray at cemeteries. Pray the eternal rest prayer."

So, what does the Roman Catholic Catechism teach about

this?

III. The Final Purification, or Purgatory

1030 All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven.

1031 The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. The Church formulated her doctrine of faith on Purgatory especially at the Councils of Florence and Trent. The tradition of the Church, by reference to certain texts of Scripture, speaks of a cleansing fire: As for certain lesser faults, we must believe that, before the Final Judgment, there is a purifying fire. He who is truth says that whoever utters blasphemy against the Holy Spirit will be pardoned neither in this age nor in the age to come. From this sentence we understand that certain offenses can be forgiven in this age, but certain others in the age to come.

1032 This teaching is also based on the practice of prayer for the dead, already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: "Therefore Judas Maccabeus made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin." From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead:

Let us help and commemorate them. If Job's sons were purified by their father's sacrifice, why would we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring them some consolation? Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them. 609

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958 Communion with the dead. "In full consciousness of this communion of the whole Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, the Church in its pilgrim members, from the very earliest days of the Christian religion, has honored with great respect the memory of the dead; and 'because it is a holy and a wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins' she offers her suffrages for them." Our prayer for them is capable not only of helping them, but also of making their intercession for us effective.

The Christian Position

Hebrews 7:25 "Wherefore he is able to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by him, seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for them."

Hebrews 9:27 "And it is appointed unto man once to die, but after this the judgment."

1 Peter 1:18,19 "Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; 19 But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot:"

1 Thessalonians 5:9.10 "For God hath not appointed us to wrath, but to obtain salvation by our Lord Jesus Christ. 10 Who died for us, that, whether we wake or sleep, we should live together with him."

The story of the thief on the cross is found in Luke 20. In verses 42,43, "And he said unto Jesus, Lord, remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom. 43 And Jesus said unto him, Verily I say into thee, Today shalt thou be with me in paradise."

Other passages that can be read are: Matthew 1:21, Isaiah 53:10, Acts 4:12, and 2 Corinthians 1:21. Purgatory doesn't exist. You see many references of Jesus and others praying for people in the Bible but always it was live people praying for people who were still alive. You can't help or hurt a person's destination after they have died; pray for them now while they still live!

Thank you so much for taking the time out of your busy life to read this edition of *The Gospel Catholic*. We are thankful to be getting this to you before the end of the year. Let me update you on some prayer requests and personal items.

<u>NATION</u>At the time of this, the "Mid Term" elections have just taken place. Regardless of the results, there will always be some areas of change and adjustments. Please remember that our hope is

If you've been following our ministry, you know that the project to Colombia should have been completed in February, but delays in shipping and customs made it go on until October. SO, I am asking you to pray diligently for additional offerings to help cover the costs of printing and specifically for the funds to print 1,000,000 tracts now so we have them on hand and other ministries and missionaries don't have to wait on us when the opportunity for shipping occurs. We will need \$30,000 for this project. Rising costs affect all of us drastically but I'm asking for prayers for this ministry.

<u>MARY'S TESTIMONY</u> The lady in Brazil who was saved just days before she died of a brain aneurism left a precious testimony that I shared with you last edition. We have since printed this in tract form and have seen great responses to the English version. We have just finished the Spanish and will have 2,500 available by the time you read this. Please let us know if you'd like to receive some. We are anticipating the Portuguese to be finished by the end of the year. I am praying that we can sponsor a printing in Brazil in 2023 so that her testimony can be passed out in her heart language and to her own

people. I want to have this tract done in illustrated form as well. It will cost us \$3,000 to finalize everything; your prayers are appreciated.

PERSONAL The family is doing well! The kids are well underway on school and our health has been maintained. We have a new prayer card available on request. I will be sending out informational packets to churches this year to introduce our ministry to them. If you have a pastor or church that you'd like to receive one, let us know. I would appreciate your prayers for me as I make plans for travel in 2023. There are many doors of opportunity but I need to choose them wisely.
